CIRULAR

Whenever the excisable articles are exported outside the State it is necessary that the party has to produce Excise verification certificate to prove that the goods have reached the destination. It is noticed that many a times the parties are not producing the excise verification certificate. Hence forth it is hereby directed that the party has to submit the excise verification certificate within 10 days of reaching the destination or within 10 days of expiry of the permits. This condition should be prescribed in the export permit itself. In case the party fails to produce the EVC within the stipulated time no further permit should be issued for export and duty as if made in local sale should be collected from them. Any deviation from these instructions should be viewed very strictly.

It is also noticed that many a times the distilleries/breweries are adding machinery without producing proper bills—and permission from Excise Commissioner which is illegal. In order to calculate the total investment made so as to collect licence fee this information is must. The distillery incharge should issue instructions to the management to produce the exact investment made every year. The distillery incharge is further directed to get certificate from the distillery owner the investment made in the last five year. After obtaining the information the same should be submitted to the Head Office and incase no investment is made to the effect a certificate has to be obtained from the distillery owner and the same should be forwarded to the Head Office within 10 days of receipt of this circular with distillery incharge remarks.
